

Key Facts - InformationDESCRIPTIONOsman Empire was one of the most powerful and long-lasting dynasties in world history. The chief, called the Sultan, gained absolute religious and political power over his family. While Western Europeans generally viewed the Ottoman Empire as a threat, many historians see them as a source of great regional stability and security, including significant advances in art, science, religion and culture. ORIGIN OF THE OTTOMAN EMPIREOsman I, leader of the Turkish clans in Anatolia, founded the Ottoman Empire in 1299. Osman established an official government and granted religious tolerance to the people he overcame. In 1453, Mehmed II the Conqueror led the Ottoman Empire in capturing the city of Constantinople, the capital of the Byzantine Empire. This came to an end to the 1000-year reign of the Byzantine Empire. Sultan Mehmed made Constantinople the new capital of the Ottoman Empire and gave it a new name Istanbul. Istanbul has become an overbearing global centre of trade and culture. Bayezid II, the eldest son of Mehmed, became the new sultan after his death in 1481. THE RISE OF THE OTTOMAN EMPIRECelim I, son of Bayesid, brought Syria, Arabia, Palestine and Egypt under Ottoman control in 1517. During the reign of Suleiman the Magnificent Ottoman Empire was able to reach its peak by 1520 and 1566. This era was defined by great power, stability and wealth. Suleiman formed a unified system of law and adopted various forms of art and literature. Many Muslims considered Suleiman a religious leader and a political ruler. During the control of Sultan Suleiman, the empire expanded and covered areas of Eastern Europe. COUNTRIES PART OF OTTOMAN EMPIRERegions added by the Ottoman Empire: Turkey, Greece, Egypt, Hungary, Macedonia, Romania, Jordan, Palestine, Lebanon, Syria, Syria, a significant number of North African coastal strips. OTTOMAN ART AND SCIENCEOsman have been recognized by art centers for their successes in art, science and medicine, especially during the reign of Suleiman the Magnificent. Most of their popular art forms were associated with calligraphy, painting, poetry, textiles and carpet weaving, ceramics and music. Ottoman architecture also helped define the culture of the time. Complex mosques and unrestricted buildings were built throughout this era. Science was considered as a major field of study while advanced arithmetic, astronomy, philosophy, physics, geography and chemistry were studied and carried out in Ottoman. In besides, some of the greatest advances in medicine invented were made by the Ottomans, such as tips, catheters, scalpels, ticks, and lancets that are still in use today. RELIGIONReligion played a fundamental role in the Ottoman Empire. Even the Ottomans themselves were Muslims, they did not need the people they conquered to convert. Instead, they allowed Christians and Jews to worship without persecution. This forced the people they conquered to escape the rebellion and allowed them to rule for a long time. Sultangoth of the Ottoman Empire was called a sultan. The title of sultan was inherited by the eldest son. While the last sultan took power, he will hang all his brothers in prison. After he had his own son to gain sovereignty, he executed his brothers. There is a total of thirty-six sultans dominated by the Turkish Empire inside 1299 and 1922. The Ottoman sultan will reside in the development of the Topkapi Palace Complex in Istanbul. It contained thousands of gardens, courtyards, residential and body buildings. Part in the topkapi palace is that harem, separate quarters reserved for wives, mistresses and female slaves. These ladies were positioned to serve the sultan, while the guys in the harem complex tended to eunuchs. There is a constant threat to kill the sultan. He moved in at night to take security measures.
